The plaintiffs claim of the defen-
dants the sum of four hundred dollars,
lawful money of the United States, which
they owe to and unjustly detain from them.
For that whereas, heretofore, to-wit: on the
27th day of February A^d 1860, at Mobile,
to-wit, in the District aforesaid and within
the jurisdiction of this Court, the said defen-
dants ^{Master or Commandant of the Schooner Casfelda} William Fortu, and Richard Sheridan
by their certain bond or writing obligatory
the date whereof is the day and year aforesaid,
sealed with their seals, and now
here shown to the Court, jointly and severally
acknowledged themselves to be held and
firmly bound unto the said United States
in the sum of four hundred dollars, to be
to them paid; which said bond or writing
obligatory was and is subject to a certain
Condition thereunder written, whereby
after reciting that whereas the above

to the Collector of the District within which he may arrive, as aforesaid, with the other persons composing the crew as aforesaid, or who may have died, or absconded, or who may have been forcibly impressed in to other service, of which satisfactory proof shall be then also exhibited to the said last mentioned Collector, then and in such case the said bond or writing obligatory should be void and of no effect, otherwise it should abide and remain in full force and virtue.

And the said plaintiffs aver, that the said William Foster did not fulfill all and singular the conditions above set forth, and as a sign for breach of said condition as follows: That the said William Foster, Master or Commander of the Schooner Clotilda as aforesaid, ~~arrived at the port of Mobile,~~ ~~Mobile,~~ ~~Mobile,~~ on the _____ day of _____ which arrived at the port of Mobile ~~with the schooner~~ with said Schooner; which said port was the first in the United States at which he ~~shall~~ arrived on his return thereto, and that he

Boarder William Foster hath delivered to the Collector of the Customs for the district of Mobile, in the state of Alabama, a verified list containing, as far as he can ascertain them, the names, places of birth, residence and description of the persons who compose the company of the said Schooner called the *Clotilda* then lying in the said District; of which she was then Master or Commander, of which list the said Collector delivered to the said Master a certified Copy, it was provided that if the said William Foster shall exhibit the aforesaid certified copy of the list to the first boarding officer at the first port in the United States at which he shall arrive on his return thereto, and there and there also produce the persons named therein to the said boarding Officer, except any of the persons contained in the said list, who may be discharged in a foreign country with the Consent of the Consul, Vice Consul, Commercial agent, or Vice Commercial agent there residing, signified in writing under his hand and official seal, to be produced

failed to exhibit the aforesaid
certified ~~list~~ copy of the list composing
the Company of the said Schooner
called the Clotilda, and also to
produce the persons named therein
to the boarding officer of the United
States appointed for that purpose.
By reason of which said breach
the said bond or writing obligatory
has become forfeited, whereby an
action has accrued to the plaintiffs
to demand & have of the said
defendants the aforesaid sum of
four hundred dollars, in said
bond or writing obligatory mentioned.
The said sum is now due and
unpaid ~~therefore~~ the plaintiffs
bring suit &c.
